




UGANDA

- Uganda: landlocked country in East Africa, divided by the Equator
- Forest cover fell from 24% (4.9M ha) in 1990
 → 9% (1.8M ha) in 2018
- 3M ha lost in 25 years; at current rates, forests may disappear in 40 years (NEMA)
- From 2001–2024: 1.16M ha tree cover lost, mainly from agriculture & logging
- Deforestation = Uganda's most serious environmental concern → threatens biodiversity, livelihoods, and sustainable development



- Uganda has lost >40% of forest cover since 1990 (5M ha \rightarrow <2.5M ha)
- Annual deforestation rate: 50,000–90,000 hallost
- Only 3,500 ha restored; 5,400 ha plantations developed
- Forest loss = 8.25M tons of CO₂ emissions/year (Forest Ref. Level, 2017)
- Kampala region: 78% forest loss since 1990
- Drivers: population growth (3.2%/yr), energy demand (90% biomass use)
- If unchecked → forests could disappear by 2040

Environmental Consequesnces

- Soil erosion & land degradation → floods, landslides (esp. Mt. Elgon)
- Water cycle disruption → reduced rainfall, drying rivers/lakes
- Biodiversity loss → critical habitats destroyed
- Home to 11% of world's bird species
- 19% of Africa's amphibians
- ~54% of Earth's mountain gorillas
- Rising risk of droughts & extreme weather

Government Response

- Legislation: ban on deforestation (except food production); logging ban in reserves (2018)
- Enforcement: crackdowns on illegal logging & charcoal production (still weak)
- Protected areas: forestry reserves & wildlife sanctuaries established

- Vision 2040 & NDP III → forest cover target: 15% by 2026
- Partnerships: Forest Partnership with EU (2022)
- National Forestry Authority: nationwide tree-planting campaigns


